OrganizationProfile

The "Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation" (JPIC) is a committee established by the Custody of the Holy Land and is based in Jerusalem. The Office of the Custody's task is to inform, animate and support the Franciscan friars and the people in general in Holy Land in their formation, actions and projects on that issue. The person responsible for the Office is supported by two Commissions, one composed by friars and one by lay people (Christians and Jews). The Committee provides experiences and suggestions to contribute to integral human development, starting with justice to have peace, and to make the common home more beautiful. Animation for integral human development in the light of the Gospel, in the Custody of the Holy Land.

ProjectDescription

To follow-up with Pope Francis' Encyclical "Laudato Sii": How to care for our Common Home", the Custody of the Holy Land and the JPIC organized a special one-day conference on 12 March 2018, at the Notre Dame of Jerusalem Center where around 208 people attended. The presentation of the Encyclical was held by Jewish, Christian and Muslim representatives and scholars from Vatican, Italy, Israel and Palestine. The event began with Fr. Francesco Patton, Custos of the Holy Land who stated in his speech "the spirit and purpose" of the day fitted into the context of the 800 years of Franciscan presence in the Holy Land. Beatrice Guarrera, a journalist of the Custody presented an introduction to "Laudato Sii". His Eminence, Cardinal Turkson, was the main speaker who highlighted that the "integral ecology" is present in the teachings of Pope Paul VI and the Popes who followed him and explained the individual and community ecological footprint and the challenges of dialogue on ecology-economy integration and the way in which we deal with climate. Prof. Stefano Zamagni presented and discussed three theses of Pope Francis. Additionally, Rabi David Rosen, AJC's International Director of Interreligious Affairs (Jewish perspectives on an Integrated Ecology) according to Biblical/Rabbinic traditions and Prof. Mohammed S. Dajani Daoudi, Director and Founder of "Wasatia Academic Graduate Institute" also spoke about ecology in Islamic traditions. The funds from KHS-Holland covered the costs printed materials (in different languages) of guest speakers, transportation costs and advertisements (rollup, folders, badges and posters) while a grant from Catholic Relief Services covered the rest of the costs. CNEWA-PMP thanks KHS-Holland that enabled the conference to take place, enabling an important issue to be challenged and discussed with an interfaith presence in Jerusalem.
